

ARTICLE I

Name of the Organization

The Organization shall be known as “Christ Embassy Great Grace Students Club”, and herein be referred to as “The Organization”

ARTICLE II

Purpose of the Organization

The organization shall work towards sharing the truth and love of the gospel of Jesus Christ to the students in Carleton University.

Our Mandate

The club seeks to provide a safe and thriving community for all Carleton students who share the beliefs outlined below. Individuals will have the platform to build relationships and continue to grow in their knowledge of the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Our beliefs

1. We believe that the Bible contains the inspired and infallible Word of God
2. We believe that there is only one God eternally existent in three (3) persons; God the father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.
3. We believe in the deity of Christ.
4. We believe in the rapture of the church and the second coming of Christ.
5. We believe that the only means of being cleansed from sin is repentance and faith in the precious blood of Jesus Christ
6. We believe that regeneration by the power of the Holy Spirit through the Word of God is essential for personal salvation.
7. We believe that the redemptive work of Christ on the cross provides divine healing for the body and salvation for the soul of everyone that believes.
8. We believe that when an individual receives the Holy Spirit, he receives divine enablement for Christian service and witness.
9. We believe in the sanctifying power of the Holy Spirit and speaking in tongues.
10. We believe in the final resurrection of both the saved and the lost, the former to eternal life and the latter to eternal judgment.

11. We are convinced that the gospel is God's only saving power.
12. We are convinced that the gospel is the answer to all human problems.
13. We are convinced that the gospel is committed to our trust.
14. We are committed to the gospel.
15. We are convinced that Jesus Christ is the only way.
16. We are convinced that the gospel is the power of God.

ARTICLE III

Membership

1. The club's General Membership is open to all undergraduate students at Carleton University. The club is not exclusive towards any group of students at Carleton University.
2. Any student becomes a full member of the club after attending at least 2 club meetings.

ARTICLE IV

Executive

President of the Club

They are in charge of organizing events that cater to the spiritual, emotional and the financial needs of the members of the club and inviting new members.

Finance Officer

They are in charge of allocating resources for events and also serve as a mentor to the members of the club.

ARTICLE V

Meetings

Meetings of the General Membership

1. Meetings of the General Membership:
 - a. Meetings are held weekly to foster community and fellowship among members.

- b. These meetings are open to the whole student body and advertised through word of mouth or flyers.
 - c. The president or at least 3 members can request for a general meeting if there is an urgency.
2. Quorum of the General Membership
- o The presence of at least five members or the majority of members, whichever is less, shall be necessary to constitute a meeting of General Membership for the exercise of its powers

Meetings of the Executive Committee

1. Meetings of the Executive Committee shall
 - a. Be held at regular intervals and are for the purpose of running the club.
 - b. Votes by the Executive Committee on club business shall be declared by a simple majority.

ARTICLE VI

Leadership succession

Consensus Based

The Organization has chosen to run a Consensus Based process for its Leadership Succession. The following are the steps necessary to facilitate a Consensus Based process.

1. All club members would be informed more than a week in advance of a meeting to attempt to decide the future leadership of the club in a consensus fashion and of a meeting location and time (location and time will be at/during our weekly meetings), with virtual options available for those unable to attend in person.
2. The club membership may work towards consensus **i.e. appointing leaders who are committed to attending meetings and building community** across multiple meetings.
3. If successful, the members shall also designate a member to inform the Student Groups Administrator

4. If unsuccessful, the outgoing club president shall inform the Student Groups Administrator that the group will either pursue an election or ask for permission to have an application and interview process.
5. The club will keep meeting minutes.

ARTICLE VII:

Events

We intend to have **at least** 1 major event every month to foster fellowship among members and to reach out and invite new members. However, this can be impacted by how busy school is for a large percentage of club members.

In the situation where most of the club members may be super busy, the club will not hold a major event.

Article VIII:

Amendments

Any member can propose an amendment to the constitution. This amendment will be presented at the general meeting at the beginning of each semester.

The amendment will be discussed, reviewed and debated if needed.

A vote will take place with the general membership to decide whether to adopt the suggested amendment or not. A simple majority will be required to adopt the new amendment.

Article IX:

Impeachment

- To remove a member, our Club will first consult the CUSA Clubs Membership Removal Committee (MRC)
- The CUSA Clubs Membership Removal Committee (MRC) will advise on the next steps for the club
- Should the CUSA Clubs Membership Removal Committee (MRC) advises that the club proceed with membership removal, the following steps will take place:

Impeachment for Removing an Executive Role:

1. Grounds for impeachment of a club member include any violation of the constitution, the governing documents of CUSA, committing an act (or

- acts) which negatively affects and/or harms the interests of the clubs and its members, and/or failure to fulfill executive duties.
2. Any member can bring forward a request for impeachment to any executive. Within 10 days of receiving this request, the executive will host a meeting with the general membership. At this meeting, the complaint will be reviewed. The member bringing forward the complaint and the accused executive shall be given time to speak.
 3. A vote for impeachment with the general membership will be conducted. The accused executive shall not be permitted to vote. A simple majority will be needed to impeach the executive. Impeachment of an executive results in their removal from office and as a member of the club.

Membership Impeachment:

1. Grounds for impeachment of a club member include any violation of the constitution, the governing documents of CUSA, and committing an act (or acts) which negatively affects and/or harms the interests of the clubs and its members.
2. Any member can bring forward a request for impeachment to any executive. Within 10 days of receiving this request, the executive will host a meeting. At this meeting, the complaint will be reviewed. The individual bringing forward the complaint and the person accused shall be given time to speak.
3. A vote for impeachment within the executive will be conducted. A simple majority of executives will be needed to impeach the member. Impeachment of a member results in their removal as a member of the club.

Article X:

Dissolution

Upon dissolution of the Organization, all assets gained through CUSA shall be returned to CUSA. All other assets will be given to "Christ Embassy Christian Centre."
